Two habitual felons tried before a jury and sent to prison

The week of August 30, 2010, in courtroom 5150, the DA's Habitual Felon Team tried two habitual felons.

The first trial was of Michael Crenshaw, 25, for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny after breaking or entering, and 3) being a habitual felon. After all of the evidence was presented, just moments before both sides were to give their closing arguments to the jury, Crenshaw admitted his guilt to all charges and was sentenced to 107-138 months in prison by The Honorable Robert C. Ervin, Superior Court Judge.

The second trial was of Larrington Wilson, 26, for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny after breaking or entering, and 3) being a habitual felon. The jury returned verdicts of guilty and Wilson was sentenced by Judge Ervin to 120-153 months in prison.
