8 convicted of property crimes

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Seven defendants recently entered guilty pleas as the District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team called their cases for trial. Another defendant pled guilty before his case was called for trial. The proceedings were held during the week of January 27, 2020, before The Honorable Daniel A. Kuehnert, Superior Court Judge.

Malik Carter, 22, pled guilty to 1) breaking or entering a motor vehicle, 2) larceny of a firearm, 3) misdemeanor larceny, 4) larceny of a motor vehicle, 5) two counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 6) felony larceny and 7) resisting a public officer. Judge Kuehnert sentenced Carter to a total of 24-47 months in prison. On two occasions, police found Carter to be in possession of a stolen firearm. During one of these incidents, Carter was in a stolen vehicle.

Marilyn Aragon, 21, pled guilty to 1) two counts of identity theft, 2) two counts of obtaining property by false pretenses and 3) five counts of financial card forgery. She was sentenced to 12-24 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation.

Labrittany Morrison, 31, pled guilty to 1) obtaining property by false pretenses, 2) use of a false license in commission of a felony, 3) altering a title and 4) making a false affidavit. She was sentenced to 10-21 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 48 months of supervised probation.

Jamil Scott, 19, pled guilty to 1) second-degree burglary and 2) larceny after breaking or entering. Judge Kuehnert sentenced Scott to 10-21 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 48 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Scott must serve 60 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail.

Marquez Alston, 23, pled to 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) larceny after breaking or entering and 3) conspiracy to commit breaking or entering. Judge Kuehnert sentenced Alston to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 60 months of supervised probation. As conditions of probation, Alston must serve 30 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail and pay \$3,000 in restitution to the victim.

Ashton White, 19, pled guilty to felony breaking or entering. He was sentenced to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation.

Amanda McCorkle, 32, pled guilty to misdemeanor breaking or entering. She was sentenced to 45 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 24 months of unsupervised probation.

Angela Ervin, 52, pled guilty to misdemeanor larceny. Judge Kuehnert sentenced Ervin to two days in the Mecklenburg County Jail.
