Domestic Violence Team convicts defendant at trial; 3 others plead guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Domestic Violence Team tried two defendants in Superior Court during the week of January 30, 2017, and three other defendants entered guilty pleas. These proceedings were held before The Honorable Robert C. Ervin, Superior Court Judge.

Nelisha Arroyo, 24, was tried for simple assault. The jury found Arroyo *guilty*. She was sentenced to 45 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As conditions of her probation, Arroyo must serve 7 days in jail, complete an anger management program and perform 50 hours of community service.

Kevin Williams, 38, was tried for 1) assault by strangulation and 2) felony habitual misdemeanor assault. The jury found Williams *not guilty*.

Antonio Connor, 28, pled guilty to 1) misdemeanor violation of a domestic violence protective order, 2) unauthorized use of a motor vehicle and 3) misdemeanor breaking or entering. Connor was sentenced to 150 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation. As conditions of his probation, Connor must pay \$2,540 in restitution to the victims and wear an electronic monitor for 45 days.

Morgan Wilson, 24, pled guilty to assault on a female. Wilson was sentenced to 150 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation. As conditions of his probation, Wilson must complete a certified intervention program for batterers and perform 50 hours of community service.

William Squire, 46, pled guilty to 1) assault on a female and 2) resisting a public officer. Squire was sentenced to a total of 210 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; those sentences were suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Squire must complete a certified intervention program for batterers.
