DA's Crimes Against Persons Team tries 1 defendant; another pleads guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Persons Team recently completed a two-week trial in Mecklenburg County Superior Court. The trial, which was held February 22-March 4, 2016, was heard by The Honorable Lisa C. Bell, Superior Court Judge, in courtroom 5110. Additionally, another defendant entered a guilty plea before The Honorable Forrest D. Bridges, Superior Court Judge.

Charles Saine, 43, was tried for 1) assault on a female and 2) four counts of assault on a law enforcement officer with a firearm. The jury found Saine *not guilty*.

Barry Carnell Bolden, 50, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) felony possession of stolen goods. Judge Bridges sentenced Bolden to 17-30 months in prison.
