## **Special Victims Team calls cases for trial**

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of February 25, 2019, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Special Victims Team called two cases for trial. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5110 before The Honorable Karen Eady-Williams, Superior Court Judge.

Quay Davis, 25, filed a motion to suppress certain evidence seized or obtained by law enforcement, alleging violations of his legal rights. After hearing arguments from the defense and an Assistant District Attorney, Judge Eady-Williams denied the motion. Davis then pled guilty to 1) possession with the intent to sell or deliver cocaine, 2) possession of heroin, 3) possession of fentanyl and 4) being a habitual felon. Davis was sentenced to 78-106 months in prison. In March 2017, Charlotte-Mecklenburg police responded to a call for service in reference to an assault with a deadly weapon in the parking lot of a Charlotte hotel. No weapon was recovered, however, officers did locate baggies that contained cocaine, as well as a mixture of heroin and fentanyl.

Jury selection began in the trial of Eric Stewart, 30. On the third day of jury selection, Judge Eady-Williams continued the case.
