Man sentenced to life in prison for 6-month-old daughter's murder

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Today, Todd Eric Boderick was sentenced to spend the rest of his life in prison for the 2012 murder of his 6-month-old daughter, Keyoni Boderick. The trial, which began on March 14, 2016, was held in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Robert T. Sumner, Superior Court Judge.

The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Homicide Team tried Boderick, 29, for 1) first-degree murder, 2) felony child abuse inflicting serious bodily injury and 3) being a habitual felon. In lieu of a jury trial, Boderick requested a bench trial before Judge Sumner, as allowed under North Carolina law.

Judge Sumner found Boderick *guilty* as charged and sentenced him to *life in prison without the possibility of parole*, as well as an additional 110-144 months in prison.

Ethical obligations prohibit the District Attorney's Office from offering further comment at this time as charges against a codefendant in this case are still pending.
