Jury convicts defendant of assault, weapon offenses

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Today, a jury found Justin Savon Dixon guilty of offenses connected with the November 2012 murder of Michael Crawley and the shooting of his friend. The trial began March 16, 2015, in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Gregory R. Hayes, Superior Court Judge.

Dixon, 24, was tried for 1) first-degree murder, 2) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury and 3) discharging a weapon into occupied property. Today, the jury found him *guilty* of assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury and discharging a weapon into occupied property. The jury found him *not guilty* of murder. Judge Hayes sentenced him to a total of 50-84 months in prison.
