Rapist, armed robbers among 31 defendants convicted by Crimes Against Persons Team

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Persons Team convicted 31 defendants March 25-28, 2013, in Mecklenburg County Superior Court. The defendants entered their guilty pleas before The Honorable Linwood O. Foust and The Honorable Lucy N. Inman, Superior Court Judges.

Darlene Enos, 37, previously pled guilty to 1) conspiracy to commit first-degree rape and 2) conspiracy to commit first-degree sex offense. On March 25, 2013, Judge Foust sentenced Enos to 120-153 months in prison. Upon her release from prison, Enos is required to register as a sex offender. Enos conspired with Vincent McDougald, whom she met online, to sexually assault Enos' young daughter. McDougald, 43, previously pled guilty to two counts of first-degree sex offense of a child and was sentenced to 276-341 months in prison. Among the defendants who pled guilty were:

Roderick Underwood, 49, pled guilty to 1) statutory rape and 2) first-degree rape. Underwood was sentenced to 292-360 months in prison. Upon his release from prison, Underwood is required to register as a sex offender and be subject to satellite-based electronic monitoring for the rest of his life.

Lejarris Williams, 31, pled guilty to robbery with a dangerous weapon. He was sentenced to 51-74 months in prison. Williams robbed an employee at Presbyterian Orthopaedic Hospital in Charlotte as the employee was leaving work in July 2012. For more information about Williams' conviction, [click here](#).

Jeric Davis, 32, pled guilty to 1) assault with a dangerous weapon with the intent to kill and 2) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury. Davis was sentenced to 52-88 months in prison.

Dominique Glover, 21, pled guilty to robbery with a dangerous weapon. Glover was sentenced to 51-74 months in prison.

Terry Tedder, 28, pled guilty to 1) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury and 2) possession of a firearm by a felon. Tedder was sentenced to 30-48 months in prison.

Marvin Williams, 44, pled guilty to common law robbery. Williams was sentenced to 23-28 months in prison.

Chico Caldwell, 25, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a felon. Caldwell was sentenced to 12-24 months in prison.

Brandon Ayers, 19, pled guilty to felony possession of stolen goods. Ayers was sentenced to 4-14 months in prison.

Note: Almost all guilty pleas entered in criminal administrative court are the result of an agreed upon plea arrangement between the State and the defendant, which is then approved by the sentencing judge.
