DA's Property Team convicts ten defendants during trial week of April 2

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of April 2, 2012, the DA's Property Team called cases for trial in courtrooms 5130, 5150 and 5370. The courthouse was closed on Friday due to a state holiday.

Isaiah Dearl Sanders, 22, was tried in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Richard L. Doughton, Superior Court Judge, for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny and 3) two counts of felony possession of stolen goods. The jury returned a verdict of *guilty* on all charges. Judge Doughton sentenced Sanders to 20-24 months in prison.

Nine defendants pled guilty before or shortly after their cases were called for trial.

James Chisun Curd, 36, pled guilty to 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny and 3) felony possession of a stolen vehicle. Judge Doughton sentenced Curd to 18-22 months in prison.

Hassan Jamil Fisher, 21, pled guilty to felony breaking or entering a motor vehicle. Judge Doughton sentenced Fisher to 8-10 months in prison.

Javon Partae Turner, 19, pled guilty to 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny and 3) felony possession of stolen goods. Judge Doughton sentenced Turner to 8-10 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 60 months of supervised probation. As a condition of probation, Turner must complete 100 hours of community service and pay \$1,034.25 in restitution.

Joshua Daniel Silk, 19, pled guilty to 1) felony larceny and 2) two counts of felony possession of stolen goods. Judge Doughton sentenced Silk to 6-8 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 60 months of supervised probation.

Sedrick McCarty Jr., 27, pled guilty to 1) two counts of uttering a forged instrument and 2) two counts of obtaining property by false pretense. The Honorable Linwood O. Foust, Superior Court Judge, sentenced McCarty to 8-10 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 60 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, McCarty must pay \$1,915.13 in restitution.

David A. Smith, 28, pled guilty to 1) felony larceny and 2) felony possession of stolen goods. Judge Foust sentenced Smith to 7-9 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Demareo Ericson Roddey, 19, pled guilty in courtroom 5150 before The Honorable Jesse B. Caldwell, III, Superior Court Judge, to felony attempted breaking or entering. He was sentenced to 5-6 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation.

Terrence Mitchell Poe, 49, pled guilty to 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny, and 3) felony possession of stolen goods when his cases were called for trial. Judge Caldwell sentenced Poe to 7-9 months in prison for the felony breaking or entering and the felony larceny charges; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 30 months of supervised probation. As a condition of probation, the defendant must serve 15 days in jail. Judge Caldwell also sentenced the defendant to 7-9 months in prison for felony possession of stolen goods; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 30 months of supervised probation. As a condition of that probation, the defendant must serve an additional 15 days in jail. Furthermore, Judge Caldwell ordered that if the defendant is later found in violation and revoked from probation, the sentences shall be served consecutively.

Eric T. Marshall, 19, pled guilty to 1) felony breaking or entering and 2) felony larceny. Judge Caldwell continued sentencing to May 18, 2012 to obtain a pre-sentencing report from the state probation office and to receive further information from the defense and the District Attorney's office.
