Jury convicts defendant; 5 others plead guilty to domestic violence crimes

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Domestic Violence Team tried one case before a jury, and five other defendants entered guilty pleas during the week of April 4, 2016. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5110 before The Honorable Linwood O. Foust, Superior Court Judge.

Kevin Midi, 25, was tried for 1) communicating threats, 2) assault by strangulation and 3) assault on a female. The jury found Midi *guilty* of communicating threats and *not guilty* of assault by strangulation and assault on a female. Midi was sentenced to 30 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 12 months of supervised probation.

David Krejci, 44, pled guilty to assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury. Krejci was sentenced to 58-82 months in prison. In December 2015, Krejci attacked his husband with a crowbar in their home. He then took a photograph of the victim's bloodied body and sent the photo to another person, who called police.

Antwan Mobley, 28, pled guilty to 1) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury and 2) assault on a child under age 12. Mobley was sentenced to 40-60 months in prison. In July 2015, police responded to a motel where Mobley and the victim were living. Mobley used hotel furniture to beat the victim, who was pregnant, in the presence of five children. Mobley then fled the scene, and the victim was transported to a hospital with serious injuries.

Roger Degree, 25, pled guilty to assault by strangulation. Degree was sentenced to 18-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Degree must complete a certified intervention program for batterers.

Deangelo Handy, 27, pled guilty to two counts of assault on a female. Handy was sentenced to 150 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail.

Ahmed Abdellatif, 24, pled guilty to assault on a female. Abdellatif was granted a conditional discharge judgment.
