Burglar sentenced to 65-87 months in prison after trial

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of April 30, 2012, the DA's Property Team called cases for trial in courtrooms 5150 and 5170.

Anthony Martin, 20, was tried in courtroom 5150 for 1) first degree burglary, 2) conspiracy to commit first degree burglary, 3) common law robbery, 4) felony larceny of motor vehicle, and 5) felony financial transaction card theft before the Honorable Robert T. Sumner, Superior Court Judge. The jury returned a verdict of *guilty* on all charges. Judge Sumner sentenced Martin to 65-87 months in prison, to be followed by a second sentence of 23-37 months in prison. After Martin completes the 65-87 months in prison, the second sentence will be suspended pending his completion of 30 months of supervised probation that will include electronic monitoring. Martin was also ordered to pay \$1,000 in restitution to the victim in the case as part of his probationary sentence.

Santario Boyd, 20, was tried in courtroom 5170 for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny, and 3) felony possession of stolen goods before the Honorable Linwood O. Foust, Superior Court Judge. The jury returned a verdict of *not guilty* on all charges.

Robert Pettice, 52, was tried in courtroom 5170 for 1) felony breaking or entering a motor vehicle and 2) misdemeanor injury to personal property before Judge Faust. The jury returned a verdict of *not guilty* on all charges.

Brian McFadden, 19, pled guilty to 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny, and 3) conspiracy. Judge Sumner sentenced McFadden to 6-8 months in prison.
