Jury convicts man of vehicle break-in

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of May 28, 2019, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team convicted one defendant before a jury. The proceedings were held before The Honorable Jesse B. Caldwell, III, Superior Court Judge. Court was not held on May 27, 2019, in observance of Memorial Day.

Bradley Sikorski, 23, was tried for breaking or entering a motor vehicle. The jury returned a verdict of *guilty* as charged. Judge Caldwell sentenced Sikorski to 6-17 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 30 months of supervised probation. Judge Caldwell ordered that Sikorski's probation begin with 90 days of house arrest, as well as electronic monitoring. In 2016, Sikorski broke into the victim's car. The victim witnessed the incident and chased Sikorski. After he was apprehended, Sikorski confessed to breaking into the car.
