## Jury finds Kenan Gay not guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – A jury found Kenan Wells Gay, 25, not guilty today in connection with the March 2012 death of Robert Edward Kingston, III, 30. The trial began May 27, 2014, in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Forrest D. Bridges, Superior Court Judge.

The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Homicide Team tried Gay for second-degree murder. Today, the jury returned the verdict of *not guilty*.

The jury represents the voice of the community, and as an agency charged with seeking justice for all, the District Attorney's Office respects the jury's verdict.

"Our heartfelt condolences go out to Mr. Kingston's family at this difficult time," say Assistant District Attorneys Jay Ashendorf and Anna Greene.
