Crimes Against Property Team calls defendants to trial

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Working in two courtrooms during the week of June 27, 2016, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team called defendants to trial. The proceedings were held in courtrooms 5110 and 5370 before The Honorable Linwood O. Foust and The Honorable Julia L. Gullett, Superior Court Judges.

Charles Branham, 25, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) larceny after breaking or entering and 3) felony conspiracy. At the close of the State's evidence, Judge Foust dismissed the case.

Corey Hood, 24, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering and 2) larceny after breaking or entering. The jury found Hood *not guilty*.

Lamarr Brown, 29, was tried for 1) breaking or entering a motor vehicle and 2) misdemeanor larceny. After a jury had been selected, an essential witness for the State failed to appear in court to testify. As a result, the State dismissed the charges.
