## 2 defendants tried for property crimes; 5 others plead guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Five defendants were convicted by the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team August 18-22, 2014, in Mecklenburg County Superior Court. Over the course of the week, the team tried two defendants, and five defendants pled guilty. The proceedings were held before The Honorable Richard L. Doughton, Superior Court Judge, in courtroom 5370.

Tevin Cunningham, 23, was tried for 1) breaking or entering a motor vehicle, 2) two counts of misdemeanor larceny and 3) injury to personal property. Judge Doughton declared a mistrial when the jury was unable to reach a unanimous verdict.

Steven Black, 42, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) felony larceny, 3) felony possession of stolen goods and 4) contributing to the delinquency of a minor. The jury returned verdicts of *not guilty*.

Melissa Guillet, 36, pled guilty to three counts of embezzlement. Guillet was sentenced to 26-41 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending Guillet's successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As conditions of her probation, Guillet must serve 20 days in the Mecklenburg County jail and pay \$1,500 in restitution.

Andre Culp, 24, pled guilty to embezzlement. Culp was sentenced to 5-15 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending Culp's successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Culp must pay \$1,200 in restitution.

Mandy McCall, 25, pled guilty to 1) felony larceny by employee and 2) felony conspiracy. McCall was sentenced to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending McCall's successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As conditions of her probation, McCall must serve 30 days in the Mecklenburg County jail and pay \$205 in restitution.

Jadarian Davis, 22, pled guilty to felony breaking or entering. Davis was sentenced to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending Davis' successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Davis must serve 4 days in the Mecklenburg County jail.

Dominique Mobley, 22, pled guilty to misdemeanor possession of stolen goods. Mobley was sentenced to 45 days in the Mecklenburg County jail; that sentence was suspended pending Mobley's successful completion of 12 months of supervised probation.
