Crimes Against Property Team convicts 32

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team convicted 32 defendants in Superior Court during the week of September 3, 2019. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before The Honorable George C. Bell, Superior Court Judge. Court was closed September 2, 2019, in observance of Labor Day.

Among those convicted were:

Jamal Moore, 20, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. He was sentenced to 13-25 months in prison.

Anthony Taylor, 36, pled guilty to three counts of felony larceny. He was sentenced to 12-24 months in prison.

Khari Clary, 21, pled guilty to 1) larceny after breaking or entering and 2) identity theft. He was sentenced to 10-21 months in prison.

Kenneth Meaders, 36, pled guilty to 1) obtaining property by false pretenses, 2) three counts of breaking or entering a motor vehicle, 3) two counts of financial card theft, 4) felony larceny and 5) misdemeanor flee to elude arrest with a motor vehicle. He was sentenced to 9-20 months in prison.

Andrew Flowers, 22, pled guilty to felony breaking or entering. He was sentenced to 8-19 months in prison.

Willene Jennings, 53, pled guilty to felony larceny by employee. She was sentenced to 6-17 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 60 months of supervised probation. As a condition of her probation, she must pay \$29,997.97 in restitution to the victim business.

Note: Almost all guilty pleas entered in criminal administrative court are the result of an agreed upon plea arrangement between the State and the defendant, which is then approved by the sentencing judge.
