Habitual Felon Team sends 10 defendants to prison

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Habitual Felon Team convicted 16 defendants during the week of September 10, 2018. Ten of those defendants were sent to prison. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before The Honorable Hugh B. Lewis, Superior Court Judge. Court was not held on September 13, 2018, due to Hurricane Florence.

Among those convicted and sent to prison were:

Deshawn Moore, 40, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 2) possession with the intent to sell or deliver heroin, 3) possession with the intent to sell or deliver cocaine and 4) being a habitual felon. Moore was sentenced to 97-129 months in prison. Moore's prior convictions include common law robbery, sale of cocaine and possession with the intent to sell or deliver cocaine.

Joseph Sall, 37, pled guilty to trafficking in opium or heroin by possession. Sall was sentenced to 70-93 months in prison.

Rubin Carr, 30, pled guilty to 1) two counts of attempted felony breaking or entering and 2) being a habitual felon. Carr was sentenced to 32-51 months in prison. Carr's prior convictions include sale of cocaine, conspiracy to commit armed robbery and selling a controlled substance within 1,000 feet of a school.

Nicholas Poulos, 31, pled guilty to 1) assault with a deadly weapon on a government official and 2) possession with the intent to sell or deliver heroin. Poulos was sentenced to 30-54 months in prison.

Fredrick Monroe, 22, pled guilty to 1) breaking or entering a motor vehicle, 2) attempted felony breaking or entering and 3) being a habitual felon. Monroe was sentenced to 29-47 months in prison. He was also sentenced to an additional 5-15 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Shirley Maddalon, 50, pled guilty to attempted felony breaking or entering. Maddalon was sentenced to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 30 months of supervised probation. As a condition of her probation, Maddalon must complete substance abuse treatment through Superior Recovery Court.
