Jury convicts man of robbery, assault

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - A jury has found Jamel Whatley guilty of robbing a man and beating him with a brick. The trial, which began September 16, 2015, was held in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Hugh B. Lewis, Superior Court Judge.

Jamel Whatley, 27, was tried for 1) robbery with a dangerous weapon, 2) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon and 3) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury. On September 22, 2015, the jury found him guilty as charged. Judge Lewis sentenced Whatley to a total of 108-150 months in prison.

Jamel Whatley

In August 2014, the victim was walking along Central Avenue in Charlotte when Whatley grabbed him from behind and hit him in the face with a brick, knocking the victim to the ground. Whatley continued to strike the victim with the brick while Whatley's 16-year-old female codefendant stole the victim's iPhone from his pants' pocket. Whatley and his codefendant fled when they saw

the headlights of an approaching car. Charlotte-Mecklenburg police were quickly able to link Whatley to the robbery because he was wearing an electronic monitor as part of his postrelease supervision, and the monitor showed that he was at the scene of the crime. When Whatley was arrested – within 24 hours of the robbery – police found that he was still in
