Jurors unable to reach unanimous verdict in homicide trial

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – A mistrial has been declared in the trial of Rodwyn Antonio Taylor, who is charged with the 2018 murder of 19-year-old Psi'keem Walker. The trial began September 30, 2019, in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Louis A. Trosch, Jr., Superior Court Judge.

The District Attorney's Homicide Team tried Taylor, 31, for 1) first-degree murder and 2) felony conspiracy. On October 9, 2019, jurors indicated they were unable to reach a unanimous verdict. As a result, Judge Trosch declared a mistrial.

The charges against Taylor, as well as a codefendant, remain pending at this time.
