Domestic Violence Team tries one defendant; others plead guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Domestic Violence Team tried one defendant and others pled guilty during the week of October 12th, 2015. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5170 before The Honorable Jeffery P. Hunt, Superior Court Judge.

Clinton Moore, 34, was tried for 1) assault by strangulation and 2) assault on a female. The jury found Moore *not guilty*.

Eddie Brooks, 46, pled guilty to 1) first degree kidnapping, 2) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury, 3) assault inflicting serious bodily injury and 4) communicating threats. Brooks was sentenced to 55-78 months in prison.

Vincent Womack, 33, pled guilty to 1) assault with a deadly weapon inflicting serious injury and 2) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Womack was sentenced to 29-47 months in prison, and was sentenced to an additional 14-26 months in prison; that additional sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Womack must serve a 90-day active sentence and complete a certified intervention program for batterers.

Rolander Grice plead guilty to two counts of felony habitual misdemeanor assault. He was sentenced to 9-20 months in prison.
