Habitual Felon Team tries 1 defendant; another pleads guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Habitual Felon Team tried one defendant during the week of November 3, 2014. Another defendant pled guilty before his case was called for trial. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5170 before The Honorable W. Douglas Parsons, Superior Court Judge.

Carneal Sharod Robinson, 27, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering, 2) larceny after breaking or entering, 3) being a habitual breaking or entering status offender and 4) being a habitual felon. The jury found Robinson *not guilty*. The habitual breaking or entering and habitual felon phases of the trial could not be held due to the jury's verdicts for the other felony offenses.

James Bernard Stoney, 39, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) assault by pointing a gun. Stoney was sentenced to 15-27 months in prison.

During the course of the week, the DA's Misdemeanor Appeals Team also prosecuted cases in courtroom 5170. The team convicted seven defendants who entered guilty pleas.
