## Guilty verdicts send armed robber, felon in possession of gun to prison

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Persons Team convicted two defendants at trial November 13-17, 2014. The proceedings were held in courtrooms 5150 and 5130 before The Honorable Richard L. Doughton and The Honorable C. Thomas Edwards, Superior Court Judges.

Tommy Moses, 30, was tried for 1) four counts of robbery with a dangerous weapon and 2) two counts of attempted kidnapping. Before the trial began, Moses pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon in connection with the same incident. The jury found him *guilty* as charged. Judge Edwards sentenced Moses to a total of 201-265 months in prison.

Quacey McFadden, 25, was tried for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The jury found McFadden *guilty* as charged. Judge Doughton sentenced him to 17-30 months in prison.
