Jury convicts man of break-in; 2 plead guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – A jury recently found a man guilty of breaking into a home, and two other defendants entered guilty pleas. The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team prosecuted these defendants during the week of June 4, 2018. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5110 before The Honorable Casey M. Viser, Superior Court Judge.

Deangelo McAdams, 23, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering and 2) felony larceny. The jury found McAdams *guilty* as charged. Judge Viser sentenced McAdams to 8-19 months in prison. During the sentencing hearing, McAdams thanked the prosecutors for treating him fairly during the trial.

Keyondra Harrison, 22, pled guilty to 1) larceny by removing an anti-theft device and 2) felony possession of stolen goods. Judge Viser sentenced Harrison to 6-17 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Hoza Jones, 26, pled guilty to misdemeanor possession of stolen goods. Judge Viser sentenced Jones to 28 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail.
