Jury convicts man for assaulting ex-girlfriend

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of June 25, 2018, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Special Victims Team tried one defendant in Superior Court. The proceedings were held before The Honorable Andrew T. Heath, Superior Court Judge.

Randall Carr, 39, was tried for 1) assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury, 2) first degree kidnapping, 3) first degree burglary, 4) habitual misdemeanor assault, 5) larceny after breaking and entering, 6) assault by pointing a gun, 7) communicating threats, 8) injury to personal property and 9) injury to real property. The jury returned a verdict of *guilty* to the charges of 1) assault inflicting serious injury, a lesser included offense of assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury, 2) false imprisonment, a lesser included offense of first degree kidnapping, 3) misdemeanor breaking and entering, a lesser included offense of first degree burglary, 4) communicating threats, 5) injury to personal property and 6) injury to real property. The jury returned verdicts of *not guilty* to the charges of habitual misdemeanor assault and larceny after breaking and entering. The jury did not reach a verdict on the charge of assault by pointing a gun. On June 28, 2017, Randall Carr went to his ex-girlfriend's house and entered it without her permission. Carr began interrogating her about other men and pointed a gun at her. Carr struck the victim in the head several times causing her to suffer a laceration. Judge Heath sentenced Carr to 300 days imprisonment, the maximum allowed by law in this case.
