Jury convicts man of Plaza Midwood shooting

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Today, Jamall Monte Glenn was sentenced to at least 35 years in prison after a jury found him guilty of attempted murder and other charges in connection with a December 2016 shooting in Charlotte. The trial, which began July 15, 2019, was held in courtroom 5110 before The Honorable Lisa C. Bell, Superior Court Judge.

The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Violent Crimes Team tried Glenn, 36, for 1) two counts of attempted first-degree murder, 2) two counts of assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury, 3) robbery with a dangerous weapon, 4) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon and 5) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The jury found him *guilty* as charged today. Judge Bell then sentenced Glenn to a total of 420-540 months in prison.

Glenn's co-defendant Ebonee Ward previously pled guilty to accessory after the fact to assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury. Charges against another co-defendant, Antonio Worthy, remain pending.
