Violent Crimes Team convicts 31 defendants

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Violent Crimes Team convicted 31 defendants during the week of September 24, 2018. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before The Honorable W. Todd Pomeroy, Superior Court Judge.

Among those convicted were:

Brandon Delacerda, 20, pled guilty to 1) two counts of robbery with a dangerous weapon, 2) discharging a firearm into occupied property and 3) possession of a stolen motor vehicle. Delacerda was sentenced to 64-89 months in prison.

Anshawn Pearson, 20, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) robbery with a dangerous weapon. Pearson was sentenced to 59-83 months in prison.

Chavis Davis, 18, pled guilty to two counts of robbery with a dangerous weapon. Davis was sentenced to 51-74 months in prison.

David Jamison, 50, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) robbery with a dangerous weapon. Jamison was sentenced to 51-74 months in prison.

Austin Townsend, 22, pled guilty to robbery with a dangerous weapon. Townsend was sentenced to 38-58 months in prison.

Nathan Jones, 23, pled guilty to robbery with a dangerous weapon. Jones was sentenced to 38-58 months in prison.

Note: Almost all guilty pleas entered in criminal administrative court are the result of an agreed upon plea arrangement between the State and the defendant, which is then approved by the sentencing judge.
