Jury convicts habitual felon; another defendant pleads guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Habitual Felon Team convicted two defendants during its latest trial session. The proceedings were held the week of September 24, 2018, in courtrooms 5110 and 5130 before The Honorable Eric L. Levinson and The Honorable Lisa C. Bell, Superior Court Judges.

Dajuan Fleming, 27, was tried for 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 2) assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury and 3) being a habitual felon. A jury found Fleming *guilty* of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and *not guilty* of assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill inflicting serious injury. Fleming then admitted his status as a habitual felon. Fleming also admitted to an aggravating factor, which was being in violation of a condition of his probation for a prior offense. Judge Levinson sentenced Fleming to 80-108 months in prison. Fleming's prior convictions include possession of cocaine, felony breaking or entering and felony flee to elude arrest with a motor vehicle.

Orlando Moore, 28, pled *guilty* to felony larceny. Judge Bell sentenced Moore to 15-27 months in prison.
