Habitual Felon Team sends 10 defendants to prison

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Habitual Felon Team convicted 16 defendants during the week of September 30, 2019. Ten of those defendants were sent to prison. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before The Honorable Carla N. Archie, Superior Court Judge.

Among those convicted were:

Demarcus Bolton, 27, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 2) possession with the intent to manufacture, sell or deliver methamphetamine and 3) being a habitual felon. Bolton was sentenced to 51-74 months in prison. Bolton's prior convictions include breaking or entering a motor vehicle, felony breaking or entering and possession of cocaine.

Shelly McClure, 47, pled guilty to 1) attempted common law robbery and 2) being a habitual felon. McClure was sentenced to 38-58 months in prison. McClure's prior convictions include forgery of an instrument, attempted obtaining property by false pretense and felony larceny.

Myron McCrae, 41, pled guilty to 1) attempted felony larceny and 2) being a habitual felon. McCrae was sentenced to 35-54 months in prison. McCrae's prior convictions include multiple counts of larceny of a motor vehicle.
