## **Jury convicts felon in possession of gun; woman pleads guilty to identity theft**

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of October 28, 2019, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Crimes Against Property Team convicted two defendants in Superior Court. One was found guilty by a jury, and the other pled guilty before her case was called for trial. The proceedings were held before The Honorable Louis A. Trosch, Jr., Superior Court Judge.

Reginald Malaker, 29, was tried for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The jury returned a verdict of *guilty*. Judge Trosch sentenced Malaker to 12-24 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Katherine Anderson, 40, pled guilty to identity theft. She was sentenced to 12-24 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.
