Violent Crimes Team leads trial session

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During the week of October 25, 2021, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Violent Crimes Team tried one defendant in Superior Court. Two other defendants entered guilty pleas. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable George C. Bell, Superior Court Judge.

Denzelle Hall, 26, was tried for 1) two counts of discharging a weapon into an occupied vehicle in operation, 2) assault with a deadly weapon with the intent to kill, and 3) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The jury found him *not guilty*. Hall was also charged with being an armed habitual felon, however, the State could not proceed on that matter as a result of the verdicts on the underlying offenses.

Tameer McKoy, 35, pled guilty to three counts of common law robbery. He was sentenced to a total of 30-63 months in prison.

Raheem Crawford, 27, pled guilty to 1) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon and 2) larceny of a motor vehicle. Judge Bell sentenced Crawford to a total of 31-59 months in prison; those sentences were suspended pending his successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, he must serve 14 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail. Crawford was also ordered to pay restitution to the victim.
