Felony Crimes Team tries defendant; 2 others plead guilty

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – During a recent trial session, the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Felony Crimes Team tried one defendant before a jury and convicted two others who entered guilty pleas. The proceedings were held in courtroom 5370 before The Honorable Jesse B. Caldwell IV, Superior Court Judge, during the week of October 11, 2021.

John Callicoatte, 21, was tried for 1) felony breaking or entering and 2) larceny after breaking or entering. A jury found him *not guilty*.

Ishmael Boler, 25, pled guilty to attempted trafficking in methamphetamine by possession. Judge Caldwell sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, Boler must serve 120 days in custody.

Jamarcus Winchester, 27, pled guilty to misdemeanor possession of stolen goods. Judge Caldwell sentenced him to 45 days in the Mecklenburg County Jail; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 12 months of supervised probation. He was also ordered to pay \$600 in restitution to the victim.
