Felony Special Victims Team convicts two defendants

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Felony Special Victims Team convicted two defendants during the team's most recent trial session. A jury found one defendant guilty of sexually abusing two boys while they were in his care. Another defendant was convicted of third-degree sexual exploitation of a minor. The proceedings were held October 2-13, 2023 before The Honorable Matthew J. Osman and The Honorable Matthew B. Smith, Superior Court Judges.

Christian Watts, 28, was tried for 1) four counts of sexual offense with a child by an adult, 2) four counts of taking indecent liberties with a child, and 3) two counts of sexual activity by a substitute parent. The charges arose from the sexual assaults of two young boys for whom Watts served as a caregiver. The jury found Watts *guilty* as charged. Judge Osman sentenced Watts to 50 years in prison. Upon his release from prison, Watts will have to register as a sex offender for 30 years.

Joshua Stepnoski, 29, was tried for five counts of third-degree sexual exploitation of a minor. The jury found Stepnoski *guilty* as charged. Judge Smith sentenced Stepnoski to 6-17 months in prison followed by 36 months of supervised probation. As a condition of his probation, he must undergo sex offender treatment. Stepnoski must also register as a sex offender for 30 years.
