## **32 convicted during administrative court sessions**

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Office convicted 32 defendants during administrative court sessions in Superior Court during the week of August 19, 2024. The cases were prosecuted by the Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Violent Crimes, Habitual Felon, and Felony Crimes Teams. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before the Honorable Karen Eady-Williams, Superior Court Judge.

Among those convicted were:

Martin Rajewski, 33, pled guilty to level II trafficking fentanyl. Judge Eady-Williams sentenced him to 90-120 months in prison.

Nicolas Dominguez, 31, pled guilty to level I trafficking in methamphetamine by delivery. Judge Eady-Williams sentenced him to 70-93 months in prison. The defendant must also pay a statutory \$50,000 fine.

Omarrus Simon, 46, pled guilty to possession with intent to sell and deliver cocaine. Judge Eady-Williams sentenced him to 16-29 months in prison.

David Simpson, 27, pled guilty to 1) two counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) possession of a weapon by a prisoner. Judge Eady-Williams sentenced him to 17-30 months in prison for one count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and possession of a weapon by a prisoner. For the second count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, he was sentenced to 17-30 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation. As a condition of the probation Simpson will be placed on an electronic monitor for the first six months of the probation.

Michael Cole, 24, pled guilty to conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Eady-Williams sentenced him to 23-40 months in prison.
