Felony Crimes Team leads trial session

CHARLOTTE, N.C. - The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Felony Crimes Team convicted 5 defendants during a recent trial session that began on March 24, 2025. The session was held in courtrooms 5110, 5170, and 5370, before the Honorable Carla N. Archie, the Honorable Craig R. Collins, and the Honorable Matthew J. Osman, Superior Court Judges.

Terjuan Lister, 45, was tried for two counts of trafficking methamphetamine. The jury found him *not guilty*.

Cameron Watts, 25, was tried for carrying a concealed gun. The jury found him not guilty.

Darius Morgan, 33, pled guilty to trafficking in fentanyl. Judge Osman sentenced him to 90-120 months in prison.

William Young Jr., 26, pled guilty to three counts of trafficking cocaine. Judge Osman sentenced him to 35-51 months in prison.

Angel Martinez Jr., 30, pled guilty to possession with intent to sell or deliver cocaine. Judge Osman sentenced him to 8-19 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Cameron McVay, 37, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Osman sentenced him to 15-27 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 24 months of supervised probation.

Tariq Bruce, 25, pled guilty to felony fleeing to elude arrest in a motor vehicle. Judge Osman sentenced him to 5-15 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending his successful completion of 18 months of supervised probation. Bruce must also complete 48 hours of community service.
