Dozens convicted during administrative court sessions

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – The Mecklenburg County District Attorney's Office convicted dozens of defendants during administrative court sessions held in Superior Court between February 2, 2026 – February 27, 2026. The defendants entered their guilty pleas in courtroom 5310 before the Honorable Carla N. Archie and the Honorable George C. Bell, Superior Court Judges.

Among those convicted were the following:

Laquan Hoe, 32, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Bell sentenced him to 190-240 months in prison.

Sir-Anthony Hepburn, 24, pled guilty to 1) second-degree murder and 2) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Bell sentenced him to 157-201 months in prison.

Azbel Castro, 29, pled guilty to second-degree murder. Judge Bell sentenced him to 144-185 months in prison.

Keyshawn Boyd, 28, pled guilty to voluntary manslaughter. Judge Bell sentenced him to 48-70 months in prison.

Josiah Small, 18, pled guilty to 1) second-degree murder and 2) conspiracy to commit discharging a weapon into a vehicle in operation. Judge Bell sentenced him to 125-162 months in prison.

Demetrius Adams, 19, pled guilty to 1) discharging a weapon into an occupied vehicle and 2) conspiracy to commit discharging a weapon into vehicle in operation. Judge Bell sentenced him to 64-89 months in prison.

Zsadella Burris, 25, pled guilty to 1) eight counts of habitual larceny, 2) four counts of felony larceny, and 3) insurance fraud. For two counts of habitual larceny, two counts of felony larceny, and insurance fraud, Judge Bell sentenced Burris to 15-27 months in prison. For four additional counts of habitual larceny and one count of felony larceny, Burris was sentenced to a consecutive sentence of 15-27 months in prison. For the remaining charges, Burris was sentenced to a consecutive sentence of 15-27 months in prison; that sentence was suspended pending her successful completion of 36 months of supervised probation. Burris also received lifetime bans from all Mecklenburg County locations of the 12 victim businesses.

Shaheim Robinson, 17, pled guilty to 1) robbery with a dangerous weapon and 2) conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Bell sentenced him to 80-108 months in prison.

Felix Davila, 66, pled guilty to 1) felony death by motor vehicle and 2) felony serious injury by motor vehicle. Judge Archie sentenced him to 80-108 months in prison.

Thomas Cartee III, 25, pled guilty to voluntary manslaughter. Judge Archie sentenced him to 51-74 months in prison.

Luis Chinchilla, 25, pled guilty to misdemeanor domestic violence protective order violation. Judge Archie sentenced him to 75 days in jail.

Hennessy Creecy, 26, pled guilty to misdemeanor assault with a deadly weapon. Judge Archie sentenced her to 75 days in jail.

Joshua Perry, 40, pled guilty to 1) two counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and 2) driving while impaired. For one count of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon and driving while impaired, Judge Bell sentenced him to 19-32 months in prison. For the remaining charge, he was sentenced to a consecutive sentence of 19-32 months in prison.

Pedro Perez, 26, pled guilty to three counts of felony breaking or entering. Judge Bell sentenced him to 6-17 months in prison.

Gerald McCutchen, 38, pled guilty to habitual larceny. Judge Bell sentenced him to 12-24 months in prison.

Dorian Brinson, 35, pled guilty to common law robbery. Judge Bell sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison.

Rasean Mustipher, 25, pled guilty to one count of misdemeanor larceny. Judge Archie sentenced him to 85 days in jail.

Matthew Traylor, 33, pled guilty to 1) common law robbery and 2) possession of a stolen firearm. Judge Archie sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison.

Olandis Peay, 28, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison.

Isiah Thomas, 34, pled guilty to 1) common law robbery and 2) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced the defendant to 13-25 months in prison.

Juandrique Chambers, 28, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison. Chambers also admitted to violating the terms of his probation for a previous conviction. Judge Archie revoked that probation and activated his suspended sentence of 10-21 months in prison. That sentence will run concurrently with the new sentence.

Jacob Gilliland, 22, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 9-20 months in prison.

De'Vonte Quick, pled guilty to 1) common law robbery and 2) felony hit and run with injury. Judge Archie sentenced him to 10-21 months in prison.

Justin Schiene, 38, pled guilty to 1) two counts of habitual breaking or entering and 2) felony breaking or entering. Judge Archie sentenced Schiene to 40-57 months in prison.

Anthony Abraham, 33, pled guilty to conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 23-40 months in prison.

Shariff Hasain, 46, pled guilty to 1) two counts of habitual larceny and 2) being a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced Hasain to 77-105 months in prison.

Akeem Bailey, 38, pled guilty to 1) possession of a firearm by a convicted felon, 2) felony carrying a concealed gun, and 3) being a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced Bailey to 96-128 months in prison.

Rahmn Thomas, 51, pled guilty to one count of Level I trafficking in opium or heroin. Judge Archie sentenced Thomas to 70-93 months in prison.

Laverture Scott, 64, pled guilty to 1) attempted common law robbery and 2) being a habitual felon. Judge Archie sentenced Scott to 89-119 months in prison.

Dominic Jordan, 34, pled guilty to possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 13-25 months in prison.

Omar Galvan, 31, pled guilty to two counts of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. Judge Archie sentenced him to 15-27 months in prison.

James Grubb, 40, pled guilty to 1) level I trafficking in heroin by possession, 2) three counts of larceny after breaking or entering, 3) possession of a stolen motor vehicle, and 4) felony larceny. Judge Archie sentenced him to 70-93 months in prison.

James Saunders III, 22, pled guilty to discharging a weapon into occupied property. Judge Archie sentenced Saunders to 38-58 months in prison.
