Habitual felon sentenced to at least 10 years in prison

CHARLOTTE, N.C. – Today, a Mecklenburg County jury found Jeremy Thrasher guilty of possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The trial, which began on July 6, 2026, and concluded with today's verdict, was held in courtroom 5370 before the Honorable Roy T. Wijewickrama, Superior Court Judge.

Jeremy Thrasher, 29, was tried for possession of a firearm by a convicted felon. The jury found him *guilty as charged*. Following the guilty verdict, Thrasher admitted his status as a habitual felon. During sentencing, the State argued that an aggravating factor existed because Thrasher has been found by a court of this State to be in willful violation of the conditions of probation imposed pursuant to a suspended sentence. Thrasher admitted to the existence of that aggravating factor. Sentencing him in the aggravated range, Judge Wijewickrama sentenced Thrasher to 125-162 months in prison.

Thrasher's charges stemming from an unrelated 2024 murder remain pending.

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
